

Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary and Protection Act - 1990


(Passed By United States Congress)




- 2800 nm² / now 2900 nm²
- Jurisdiction to mean high tide
- Surrounds Florida Keys
- Co-trustee Management with State of Florida
- 60% State Waters
- 40% Federal Waters
- 1600 Keys / 1800 miles of shoreline




The FKNMS and Protection Act of 1990 prohibited ships greater than 50 meters (164 feet) from entering an "Area To Be Avoided" within Sanctuary boundaries



International Maritime Organization Designated ATBA ——



The FKNMS and Protection Act of 1990 placed a permanent ban on gas, oil, and hard mineral mining within the Sanctuary.



Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary and Protection Act - 1990

US EPA - Authorized to Develop a Water
Quality Protection Program
(EPA, State, County, & NOAA)

• Authorized a high level Water Quality Steering Committee

- Establish WQ, Coral and Seagrass Monitoring Programs























Cruise Ship landings have increased dramatically over the past 17 Years in the Port of Key West with as many as 5 cruise ship landings per day




Nearest edge of benthic resources relative to Truman Harbor, turning basin, and ship channel









The coral reefs and the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary are downstream of South Florida Ecosystem Restoration Project











Influence from Ocean Currents


Four Paths of Satellite Current-Tracking Meters




