

Fiscal Year 2010 Coral Reef Information System (CoRIS) Accomplishments

Highlights

New Metadata and Data – Added 1,481 metadata records to CoRIS and made 6,831 record updates. At the conclusion of FY10 CoRIS had a total of 4,269 metadata records that provide users access to approximately 32,841 coral data products.

New Publications – Entered 542 publications into the CoRIS virtual library and cataloged an additional 154 titles in the NOAA Library, bringing the total number of publications in CoRIS to 2,813.

Outreach – CoRIS staff attended the Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center (PIFSC) External Program Review for Scientific Data Management Systems and Capabilities, made site visits to the Southeast Fisheries Science Center (SEFSC) and the Atlantic Oceanographic, Meteorological Laboratory (AOML), Hollings Marine Laboratory, NCCOS -Center for Coastal Environmental Health and Biomolecular Research, and the NOAA Coastal Services Center.


Coral Program Support – Provided monthly, quarterly, and annual reports to the CRCP office on coral projects that contributed metadata, data, and publications to CoRIS. CoRIS staff sent 114 "overdue product letters" to CRCP-funded project managers for updates on outstanding products for fiscal years 2002-2010.

Collaborations – Served as a member of the CRCP Project Tracking and Accountability Working Group, CRCP Data Management Working Group, CRCP Project Proposal Database Review Team, Deep Sea Coral Working Group, Deep Sea Coral Coordination Call, and other CRCP coordination groups, the U.S. Coral Reef Task Force Education and Outreach Working Group, NESDIS Information Resource Management Team Metadata Meeting, NODC IT Systems Meeting, NODC Web Team Meeting, NODC Archive Management Working Group, FGDC Metadata Working Group, etc.

Content and Technical Improvements – CoRIS restructured, reformatted and updated its "Key Documents" page, increased the functionality of the Coral Data search tool, and added a search tool for the Acronyms/Abbreviations List.

The above table references, by Line Office and Program, the number of CRCP-funded and other NOAA coral publications, websites, presentations, posters, brochures, videos, etc. that CoRIS received in FY 2010.

In addition, CoRIS cleared the backlog of CRCP-funded publications previously maintained by the project. In the past 18 months more than 750 publications from CRCP Project

Managers, Grantees, and other NOAA partners that had accumulated since 2002 were cataloged in the CoRIS virtual library and the NOAA Libraries.

In FY 2010, staff successfully added a total of 542 publications into the CoRIS virtual library, modified and re-published existing titles as needed, and cataloged 154 publications in the NOAA Library.

Outreach Activities

- CoRIS staff attended the U.S. Coral Reef Task Force meeting in Washington D.C. on February 25, 2010 and provided booth materials to the September 2010 meeting.
- CoRIS staff traveled to Charleston from May 5-7, 2010 to meet with staff at the Hollings Marine Laboratory, NCCOS - Center for Coastal Environmental Health and Biomolecular Research, NIST, Southeast Regional Office Habitat Conservation -NMFS and the NOAA Coastal Services Center.
- CoRIS staff traveled to Miami from March 2-5, 2010 to meet with CRCP partners at the Southeast Fisheries Science Center (SEFSC) and the Atlantic Oceanographic and Meteorological Laboratory (AOML). The site visit included meetings with 23 CRCP Project Managers and staff members, who are a part of AOML, multiple SEFSC facilities in the Southeast (Miami, St. Petersburg, Panama City, FL and Galveston, TX), the Southeast Regional Office (SERO), and the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM).
- CoRIS staff attended the PIFSC External Program Review for Scientific Data Management Systems and Capabilities on July 20-22, 2010 and met with staff from the Coral Reef Ecosystem Division after the workshop to discuss the status of CRCP deliverables and provide an overview on the planned enhancement to the CoRIS system.

Coral Reef Conservation Program Support

- Staff sent CRCP-funded Project Managers 114 "overdue product letters" and/or requests for updates on outstanding products for fiscal years 2002-2010.
- CoRIS prepared 3 quarterly status reports detailing web use trends and highlighting project accomplishments and CRCP Project Manager submissions related to metadata, data, publications, and information products.
- 378 items (new metadata, publications, etc.) were contributed by CoRIS to 10 issues of NOAA's Coral Reef News newsletter during FY 2010.

Collaborations

 CoRIS continues to participate as a member of the following CRCP working groups: Project Tracking and Accountability Working Group, Data Management Working Group, Deep Sea Coral Working Group, CRCP Project Proposal Database Review Team, and Deep Sea Coral Coordination Call.

- CoRIS hosts a regular teleconference with PIFSC CRED staff to discuss on-going actions items and outstanding CRCP products.
- Staff attends the monthly CRCP Program Manager Check-in meeting and Coral Collaboration calls.
- CoRIS participates in meetings and working groups that fall outside of the CRCP umbrella, including the U.S. Coral Reef Task Force Education and Outreach Working Group, NESDIS Information Resource Management Team Metadata Meeting, NODC IT Systems Meeting, FGDC Metadata Working Group, NODC Archive Management Working Group, NODC Web Team and miscellaneous NODC Staff and Division Meetings.

Web Site Content and Technical Improvements

Data & Publications

- To improve the functionality of the CoRIS Web site, staff updated the Coral Data search tool to point to html copies of Federal Geographic Data Committee (FGDC) metadata records. The html metadata records are presented so that text will wrap in the browser window, all URLs will be represented as active hyperlinks, and a Table of Contents will be included to allow for easier navigation between different metadata sections.
- CoRIS staff restructured, reformatted, and added content to the "Key Documents" page, <u>http://coris.noaa.gov/data/key_docs.html</u>. This page includes links to important Legislative Mandates, the U.S. Ocean Action Plan, Reports to Congress, CRCP Strategic Guidance, Reports on the Status of Coral Ecosystems, the CRCP Technical Memorandum Series, and CRCP Accomplishment Reports.
- CoRIS staff developed the data and publications RSS feeds in response to multiple requests from users that CoRIS make new (and recent) data and publications in the CoRIS catalog more easily discoverable on the website. There are now two dynamic RSS feeds now available on the website which are updated daily. One feed lists the 50 most recent publications added to the catalog while the second feed lists the 50 most recent metadata records which have been added or updated in the system.
- The overall performance of the CoRIS Map Search tool was improved. The updated tool has increased navigability and allows faster loading for users with slow internet connections.
- CoRIS staff restructured the workflow for cataloging CRCP and other NOAA coral
 publications in the CoRIS virtual library and NOAA Central Library. This involved
 intense collaboration with NOAA Central Library staff and resulted in an exponential
 growth in the number of coral ecosystem-related publications submitted to and
 cataloged by the NOAA Library as well as the number of publications cataloged by
 CoRIS staff in the CoRIS virtual library. The new cataloging protocols and procedures
 greatly expedited the clearing of the backlog of CRCP-funded and other NOAA coral
 publications that had been maintained by CoRIS.

Regional Portal

The Regional Portal provides users with a wide range of region specific data and information from a single page. In FY10 CoRIS staff completed the Regional Portal metadata records for the final location (NWHI). Tagging efforts for nine locations were completed in less than 18 months time. This achievement permitted CoRIS to submit an important deliverable to the CRCP two and a half years ahead of schedule. In the finalized portal there are fourteen (14) regions with appropriate geographic tags to enhance targeted metadata searches.

Ecosystem Essays & Professional Exchanges

- As part of its continuing efforts to better serve users by presenting region-specific coral data and information in a clear, concise, and integrated manner, CoRIS developed two new ecosystem essays; one about the Republic of Palau, the other about Guam. Glossary/Acronym & Abbreviation List

- CoRIS launched a revised version of the *Glossary* application and a new dynamic version of the *Acronym/Abbreviation List*. The *Glossary* application was updated to meet current NOAA IT security requirements. The *Acronym/Abbreviation List* was converted from static html to an asp.net application.
- CoRIS added a search tool for the Acronym/Abbreviation List to increase the usability and functionality of this expanding resource. This new feature gives users the ability to quickly search the list by acronym or keyword, thus providing accurate concise search results.
- The CoRIS Glossary Reef Ecosystem Terminology continues to grow and now has more than 6,180 coral reef ecosystem related definitions. In addition an updated pdf version of the CoRIS Glossary was made available for download. The PDF Glossary was updated to include additional terms and has been expanded with a more user friendly means of navigation within the file.
- CoRIS continues to update its Acronyms/Abbreviations List (<u>http://coris.noaa.gov/data/acronyms.html</u>), which now has more than 4,700 terms.
