FY 2006 Coral Reef Grant – Ulua Tagging Project, Neighbor Island Coordinator

April 1, 2007- September 30, 2007

During this reporting period, the Ulua Tagging Project, Neighbor Island Coordinator continued to assist the Hawaii Division of Aquatic Resources expand the project to neighbor islands by participating in state-wide fishing club meetings and tournaments and disseminating tagging kits to anglers and distributing HDAR tagging newsletters which provides commercial and recreational fishermen with information on the number of fish tagged, recaptured, days at liberty as well as growth between captures.

The Neighbor Island Coordinator also assisted HDAR staff in updating and maintaining the Ulua Tagging database, including data entry of information received from fishermen via data information cards and phone calls. When fish are tagged, information such as length, weight and capture location are recorded by the angler and submitted to HDAR. This information is then key-punched into a database along with the name, address and other contact information of each volunteer angler and the serial number of each individual tag issued to the angler. When tagged fish are recaptured, the information is again recorded in the database and used to generate summaries of growth, movement and other population parameters. Additionally, HDAR is now collecting information such as weather patterns, tide data, and other observations in order to identify patterns that may help indicate preferred environmental conditions/indicators for ulua species.

Fishermen who participate in the tagging program and tag or recapture fish are provided with reward items such as T-shirts, stickers and other prizes for participating. The Neighbor Island Coordinator assists HDAR in processing tagging information, verifying the identity of the angler and preparing and distributing reward packets. In addition, The Neighbor Island Coordinator assists HDAR in calculating the number of fish tagged by each individual angler. This information is listed in the Ulua Tagging Newsletter which provides a feedback mechanism to fishermen on how their information is being used by managers. (See attached Newsletter for 2007).

October 1, 2007- March 31, 2008

With funding provided by the CRFMPGP, the Council hired a contractor to be housed at State of Hawaii Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Aquatic Resources to assist with the Ulua Tagging Project. The project is a state-wide volunteer angler-based fish tagging program which utilizes fishermen to capture, tag and release species of carangid jacks commonly known in Hawaii as ulua or papio (juvenile). These species are a popular recreationally caught marine fish, however very little information is available regarding the status of these species. The program encourages fishermen participation in collecting vital information which assists fishery managers in understanding seasonal recruitment, growth rates, and movement patterns of these species. The primary tasks of the contractor was to assist the Hawaii Division of Aquatic Resources (HDAR) in their efforts to expand their Ulua Tagging Project to the islands of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, Lanai and Molokai and assist in the analysis of mark/recapture data collected by fishermen.

Under this project, the Council supported travel the contractor to participate in fishing tournaments organized by fishing supply companies, fishing clubs and other organizations on the neighbor islands. The contractor distributed tagging kits, to major fishing and tackle stores, as well as DAR tagging newsletters providing commercial and recreational fishermen with information on the number of fish tagged, recaptured, days at liberty as well as growth between captures. Over the course of the project, a total of 75 *papio* tagging kits and 51 *ulua* tagging kits have been distributed to fishing tackle and supply stores in Hilo, Kona, Kailua-Kona, Kamuela Wailuku, Lihue, and Kaunakakai.

In May 2006, the HDAR released its first technical report (No. 06-01) on the results of this project from 2000 through 2004. According to the report, the Ulua Tagging Program has recruited over 1,200 volunteer fishermen with 865 on Oahu, 60 on Kauai, 156 on Maui, and 166 on the Big Island. According to the report, over 22,000 fishes were tagged and a total of 2,900 fish recaptured (12.7%) with several individuals being recaptured on different islands.

With assistance of the Neighbor Island Coordinator, the Ulua Tagging Project has resulted in over 30,000 fish being tagged through December 2007 with approximately 3700 tagged on Hawaii Island (900 tagged in 2007), 5700 on Maui (460 tagged in 2007), 1000 on Kauai (218 tagged in 2007), 424 tagged on Molokai (21 tagged in 2007) 131 on Kahoolawe (14 tagged in 2007) and nearly 50 on Lanai (3 tagged in 2007).





Year of the record rains on Kauai & Oahu!

2006 started out to be a slow year for tagging. Part of the reason for the slow start this year could be attributed to record rainfalls in March and April. During this time fishing was very poor around the islands especially on Kauai and Oahu. The slow fishing lasted for up to a month after the heavy rains had stopped. Based on previous years of tagging data the month of March is when we normally see the 6"& 7" papio along the nearshore areas. So it appears the rains may have had some an effect on this recruit class during this time of the year.

As a note of interest I spoke with a Hawaiian fishing practitioner after the big rains came in March and April early last year. I wondered what he had to say about the effects of the rain on our ocean resources. He predicted, based on the Hawaiian moon calendar (month, day, moon phase, and time of rain) with all the elements correctly lined up that within 6 months after the rain, fisheries would improve. So far 2006 is ending as a great year for recruits of the following species moi lii, alolehole, sardines, halalu, and juvenile papio.



What could possibly be a result of heavy rains and freshwater runoff from early last year, is the abundance of juvenile recruits for a number of species. This year the following juvenile recruits have been reported in great numbers aholehole, moi lii and oama. These reports have been based on fishermen observations throughout the main Hawaiian Islands.

We received a report in November 2006 from a troller on Oahu that caught a large ahi and found in its stomach some shrimp, ika (squid), and lots of moi lii! As many of you know most of our nearshore fish are broadcast spawners, where their eggs are released in nearshore waters and eventually drift out to sea. Once at sea the eggs hatch and develop into larvae (pelagic stage), where they feed in plankton rich waters. Once the larvae reach a certain stage of development they will migrate to our nearshore waters.

In December 2006 a good friend of mine Kurt Kawamoto from NOAA Fisheries was bottomfishing 4 miles out of Waianae at night and captured some specimens of juvenile moi lii and goatfish when these came near the lights of their vessel (see photo). Note the interesting color pattern of the juvenile moi lii and oama in their pelagic stage.

When favorable conditions for currents, nutrients, and a good spawn exist, we have blooms in certain fish populations. Much like the aweoweo run in the summer of 2003, some of you may remember other blooms of fish in past years such as balloon fish, file fish, nehu, sardine, broomtail file fish, etc. This year it appears to be the year of the moi lii.

Our nearshore waters are dependent upon favorable currents to transport larvae and nutrients to our islands that help nourish and replenish fish stocks (annual runs). The ocean rich currents around our islands bring life to our nearshore waters the same way rain brings life to our lands.

If you have seen unusual aquatics events such as the bloom of moi lii, aweoweo run etc., please let us know so that we can document these special occurrences and or events.





Tagging Trends

Larger Fish Being Tagged

Over the years we have noticed that our taggers have been tagging more of the larger sized papio. Many of the papio tagged this year have ranged in size from 10" to 14" FL. This is great, since we have lacked tagging data on these bigger papio. From the start of this project we have seen a general trend where seasoned anglers are tagging larger fish each year. Great job!





Higher Recovery Rates for Larger Sized Tagged Papio

Since October of 2006 the data has shown a good number of papio recruits being tagged between 6" to 7" fork length, This seems to be the second recruit class for the year. (If possible we would like to ask all of our taggers to refrain from tagging papio smaller than 7" fl. This is because upon analyzing our recovery data we find that papio smaller than 7"fl. show a lower percentage of recovery rates. Remember to tag only strong healthy papio to improve survival rates. If current trends continue through 2007 we could end the year with a bang especially if the smaller papio stick around. This could mean a good run of 10" to 12" papio this coming summer.



Not only have fishermen been tagging papio and ulua but they have also been re-releasing many of the tagged fish that they have been catching. An average of 66% of all tagged fish recaptured have been reported and re-released. Re-releasing tagged fish will give scientists more information by individual tracking the growth rates and movement of each fish which can be plotted over time with a number of re-releases. Even if you don't tag papio/ulua you can still help provide valuable information by reporting and re-releasing tagged papio/ulua. The information that we need is the tag number, date captured, fork length (measurement from the nose to the V in the tail), time, and location of recapture. We have had a few fish that have been recovered and re-released up to 5 times! There are many other tagged papio/ulua that have been re-released




"Da List"







Ulua Tagging Project Technical Report

In May 2006 we published and distributed "Hawaii's Ulua and Papio Tagging Project 2000 to 2004" technical report no. 06-01. Copies of the report are available free through all DAR offices statewide and at some tackle shop locations on Oahu only (quantities are limited). For those of you with computers a PDF file of the report is available on our DAR website at: http://www.hawaii.gov/dlnr/dar/library/index.htm The report contains information on juvenile papio growth rates, travel, distribution and fish facts on popular carangid species. All of the tagging information contained in this report was gathered through our project volunteers statewide.

Recovered a tagged fish?

The most important action that anglers can do to assist any tagging project is to report all tagged fish caught.

Recovery information on tagged fish along with tagging data generates important information on growth rates and distance traveled by these jacks.


For each ulua/papio that is recovered we will generate a recovery letter for the angler and tagger with information on the number of days at liberty, distance traveled, and growth.

At the time of capture it is important to record the following information:


- 1) Date of capture
- 2) Tag number
- 3) Length of fish (fork length)
- 4) Species
- 5) Location
- 6) Time
- 7) Weight (optional)

All above information must be received in order to receive a t-shirt reward.

How to measure your Fish!



Fork Length (fl.) Is the measurement from the <u>tip of the</u> nose (A) to the <u>fork</u> in the tail (B).

Recovery Options:

- A) Re-release of tagged ulua/papio, leave tag in fish, remove algae from tag, and record tag number along with above information. Then gently release the fish.
- B) Fish to be kept; remove tag and report the above information. (Please keep the tag to be returned to DAR, we will provide you with an self addressed envelope when you call our office).
- C) Report tag fish recoveries to DAR at (808) 5870593. If we are not available please leave your name, address, and phone number with the required information.

Dear Volunteer Angler,

Thank you very much for all the time and effort you've put in as a volunteer angler for DAR's Ulua Tagging Project. Along with 2000 anglers statewide, you have shown that Hawaii's fishermen care very much about their fishery resources and are more than willing to help take better care of our ulua and papio fishery by gathering the information necessary for DAR to better manage these species for now and future generations. Because of all of our volunteer anglers' combined efforts, in only 6 short years, you've managed to help us gather a lifetime worth of data and information, some of which was previously unknown about Hawaii's ulua and papio resources. It is anglers like you that have made this one of the most successful volunteer angler-based tagging projects ever.

As of 2005 the Ulua Tagging Project has accumulated enough tag and recapture data to begin work on assessing the omilu (*Caranx melampygus*) populations. With the current level of volunteer effort, it has been determined that by the end of 2007, there should be enough tag and recapture data collected to assess the white ulua/papio (*Caranx ignobilis*) populations also. The stock assessments for these two species will assist DAR with updating its management regimen for the ulua and papio fishery.

We will continue to distribute tagging kits until December 31, 2007 in order to obtain the amount of data necessary to conduct a stock assessment for the white ulua/papio species. At this time DAR will no longer be acquiring any new volunteer anglers for the project. Tags will continue to be distributed on a limited basis to those anglers that already possess a tagging kit. All further tag and recapture efforts will be refocused toward helping us to monitor the ulua and papio fishery as we update management strategies for these species. We will continue to collect and process whatever tag and recapture data comes in after 2007 and honor all recaptures that are reported.

We truly appreciate all the aloha and generous support you've given to the Ulua Tagging Project and for your unique and valuable insight on Hawaii's ulua and papio fishery. We hope to use all the knowledge and information gained from this project to enhance our understanding on the biology of the ulua and papio species which will assist DAR in better managing the ulua and papio fishery for everyone. Again, thank you for participating as a volunteer angler and we hope that we can work with you again in some capacity on another future project.

The Neighbor Island Outreach Coordinator position has been a tremendous asset to the Division of Aquatic Resources' Ulua Tagging Project. Mr. Richard Beebe has been under contract as the Neighbor Island Outreach Coordinator since December 2005 and has already increased DAR's capabilities in promoting Project awareness statewide. This is especially true regarding outreach and educational opportunities for the Ulua Tagging Project on the neighbor islands.

During the brief time we have had this position, it has brought many benefits to the Project. One of the most important aspects has been information outreach amongst tackle dealers and anglers statewide. The position brings much needed services and support for the volunteer anglers especially for our neighbor islands.

Mr. Beebe has opened the lines of communications with several tackle dealers on the islands of Maui, Kauai, and Hawaii. Some of these contacts have already started promoting the Project among their islands' anglers and a few have even started voluntarily distributing tag kits. These activities will help promote Project growth in terms of awareness and understanding.
