1. <u>Project Needs and Results</u>

Soufriere is a small town located on the south west coast of St. Lucia. The area is an established tourist destination and sustains an important artisanal fishery and has numerous local recreational areas. The Soufriere Marine Management Area (SMMA) is a marine park established to protect and conserve marine resources particularly the well-developed fringing coral reefs which is important to both the fishing and tourism sectors. Geographically, part of the SMMA also falls within the designated Pitons Management Area which is the only World Heritage Site in St. Lucia.

The SMMA was formally established by the Government of St. Lucia on July 1st, 1995 with technical assistance from the French following a series of stakeholder consultations and negotiations with an aim to conserve natural coastal and marine resources and facilitate sustainable use of the area. The Agreement to Manage the Soufriere Marine Management Area was reviewed in 1998 and again in 2003. In 2005, a ten year institutional review of the Soufriere Marine Management Association was conducted. Included in the review was a proposed socioeconomic monitoring to provide a baseline for future monitoring.

Awareness of the social and economic factors affecting the SMMA will allow the management staff to tailor management strategies to suit the current socioeconomic climate. This information gleaned from socioeconomic monitoring will also be used to demonstrate to the public and to policy makers the importance of protecting the coastal and marine environment and garner support for revising and implementing new management policies.

2. Project activities

- 1. Stakeholder Consultation: The first phase of the project involved sensitization of relevant stakeholders to the objectives of the project. A workshop was held on 30 January 2007 to discuss the objectives and form an assessment team. A total of nineteen (19) participants attended this workshop and all persons gave the project their full support.
- 2. Data collection through secondary sources: Reports from previous institutional reviews and projects with a socioeconomic component were compiled and used as references.
- 3. Data collection through surveys: Through a collaborative process involving staff from the SMMA, Department of Fisheries (DOF) and Central Statistics Office (CSO) a comprehensive survey instrument was developed. A total of 200 surveys were conducted on various users of the coastal and marine environment encompassing the SMMA. The users were subdivided into the following groups: Households within the Soufriere community (120), Fishermen (40), Divers/Snorkellers (17), Hotels and Small Business Owners/Managers (8) and Boatmen (15) were surveyed (Table 1.).

Five enumerators were trained and sent out in the field for data collection from 25 July -15 August 2007. Data entry into a database developed by the SMMA Project Officer commenced on August 21. This data will be imported into a dedicated statistical program (SPSS) for detailed analysis at the Central Statistics Office.

Description <u>The original completion date for this project was slated for 15 March 2006</u>. An extension was granted for March 2007. Due to the delay in disbursement of funds, a request was made for a further extension.

A series of technical meetings were held to determine the target population and develop a survey instrument. Consultations were held with representatives from the Department of Fisheries, Coastal Zone Management Unit and Central Statistics Office. A pilot survey was conducted and the survey has been finalized and is ready for field data collection.

A training workshop was held for all enumerators prior to data collection. Sample surveys were used to troubleshoot a database developed by the Project Officer with assistance from the Central Statistics Office. Data collected was compiled in a well organized database and will be exported to a dedicated statistical program, SPSS for analysis. The expertise of a statistician will be required for detailed statistical analyses.

4. Use of outputs

The socioeconomic data gathered from this project will be utilized to direct or redirect management strategies to achieve the organization's mandate. Since the inception of the organization, some of the issues affecting the Soufriere Marine Management Area have been solved, others have evolved and new issues are still emerging.

In keeping with specific objective 1 of this project, data has been collected and we now have a better understanding of the perception of various community groups on the performance of SMMA in the past ten years. While various user groups are more au courant with the work and role of SMMA within the community, preliminary data shows there is a stark difference in the level of awareness of the existence of SMMA and its work between coastal and inland residents. There was an overwhelming call for SMMA to undertake more education and sensitization and to participate in community activities.

These results will be presented in the project report to the SMMA Board of Directors and to the following organizations: UNEP-CAR/RCU, Department of Fisheries, Department of Statistics, Coastal Zone Management Unit, St. Lucia Hotel and Tourism Association, Soufriere Regional Development Foundation and the Pitons Management Area and all interested stakeholders. The report will also be made available online on the SMMA website.

5. Degree of achievement of the objectives/results

The survey instrument which was developed was instrumental in gathering information on the perception of the public on various aspects of the Soufriere Marine Management Association. Pending further analysis, the preliminary results indicate that 90% of respondents are aware of the SMMA thus by extension, the majority of the Soufriere populace. All users of the SMMA with the exception of the households were aware of SMMA activities. Among the households, the Fond St. Jacques community was the least aware of the SMMA and coincidentally almost all of these respondents commented on the lack of education and information dissemination by SMMA to that community. Preliminary results also indicate a general consensus that the

quality/quantity and health of coral reef, fish, beaches and water quality is declining. From this it is obvious that the SMMA Communication Plan needs to be revisited and monitoring needs to be continued and the results communicated to the general public. The importance of sensitizing the public to the importance and value of our natural resources is paramount for the sustainability of these resources.

A more detailed analysis of the results of the survey will be included in the project report document. A copy of this document will be forwarded to UNEP-CAR/RCU for review.

6. <u>Conclusions</u>

This project was conceptualized by the manager of the SMMA following a Socioeconomic workshop held in Soufriere in 2005. The project was started in January 2007 after a Project Officer was appointed but had not attended the aforementioned socioeconomic workshop. A survey instrument was developed through governmental and organizational collaboration. Data collection was delayed till funding was made available in July 2007. In hindsight, data collection should have continued as scheduled once funding had been guaranteed.

During this period, two databases were developed simultaneously utilizing MS Access and MS Excel. Data entry and queries will be done in Access and the tables exported to Excel and SPSS for statistical analysis and creation of charts. Although the Excel database was easier to develop, data entry proved tedious due to program limitations in the number of fields that can be displayed in the form. The Access database posed an array of problems that were finally resolved and the database was made user friendly.

With only one individual for data entry the data entry period was extended due to the length of the questionnaire and the number of records to be entered. Another key lesson reiterated is the need to develop a habit of saving data after entering each record after numerous records were lost after two instances of power failure following the passage of Hurricane Dean.

7. <u>Recommendations</u>

- (a) Future in depth reviews of the SMMA should ideally be conducted by a private consultant or a government watchdog agency to obtain unbiased data from all stakeholders including staff of SMMA. Subsequent reviews should also be undertaken periodically every five years with a short survey and more comprehensive survey should be done every ten years.
- (b) The direction the stakeholders wanted to take this project to was too broad for a project of this size.
